Professor Johnson has worked on several assignments for the World Bank and UNICEF across many countries in Africa, including Nigeria, Sudan, and Somalia. He is the founder of a new University of Oxford Social Impact Spin-out Company (OxTrack), designed to assess and support the professional capabilities of African teachers. His intervention interrogates the idea of the University in Africa, the nature of knowledge, and the meaning of scientific endeavour, in a world rapidly changing world.

Avoiding the Rankings Rabbit Hole: Know yourself, know your contexts, and know where your own warren of higher education is leading

Head of Education for Southern Africa at UNESCO's office in Harare, Zimbabwe, and former Chief of Global Higher Education at UNESCO, Paris, where he drafted the text of the Addis Ababa Convention for Africa, the Buenos Aires Convention for Latin America and the Caribbean, and the revised Convention for the Arab States —each of which has quality assurance and university cooperation in teaching and research as a foundation. He is the author of policy papers, articles, and monographs on the topics of higher education reforms, quality assurance, internationalization, digital transformation, university rankings, and equity and inclusion in national HE systems.




PROFESSOR SIOUX MACKENNA
